Leon M. Abbott Scholarship Winners

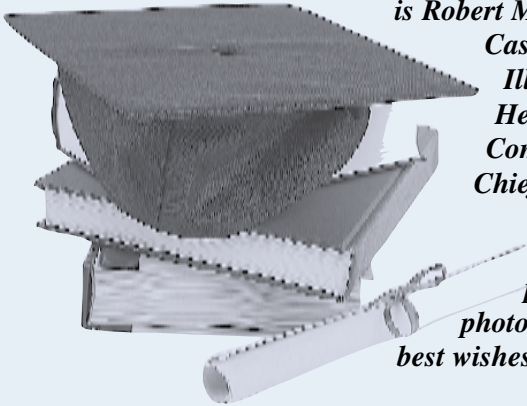

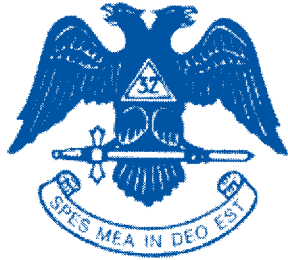

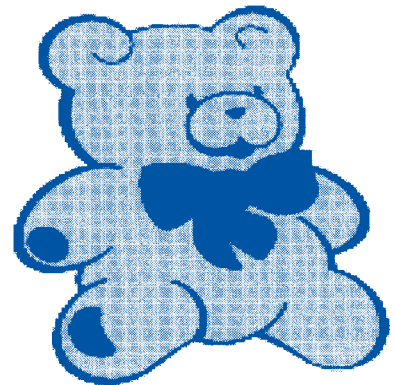
